Where do you find inspiration?

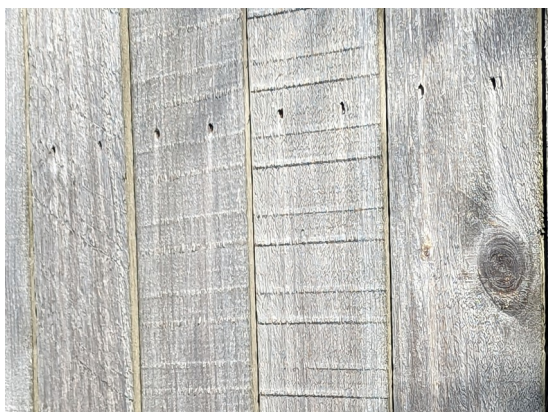
Do you look for it everywhere?

March Program

Our program for this month will be presented by members of the West Side Study Group. We will present items we have made using linen from Marianita Porterfield.

The program for our April luncheon will be presented by Leslie Goddard who gives history lectures and historical portrayals. In this living history performance, she will portray Georgia O'Keefe, the legendary artist and modernist.

Our May speaker is Deb Essen whose program will be on supplemental warps. There will be a workshop on Thursday, May 11, and Friday, May 12. The class explores weaving with supplemental warps without needing a second back beam. We will discuss how supplemental warps work, designing for textiles using supplemental warps, learn how to set up your loom for supplemental warps and weave samples in class.

The Michigan League of Handweavers will hold their conference at Hope College in Holland, Michigan on June 9-11, 2023. There are workshops from June 12-14, 2023. Registration is open. You can find further information on their website at www.MLHguild.org.

Dear Lucy Column

Since nobody had a question for me last month I thought I would address a comment that I overheard during the meeting. Several people wanted to know where they might find a book that would give definitions for some of the terms that are slung around when we discuss our weaving and spinning . A few examples would be PPI or EPI . EPI, which stands for ends per inch, refers to how many threads we are using in the warp or the threads on the loom. PPI, or picks per inch, corresponds with how hard you are beating or laying in the weft yarns. There is a glossary in the book called THE HANDWEAVER'S PATTERN BOOK . All throughout the book, there are terms used that may help clear up some of your questions. Any member at the meeting would be more than willing to fill in the blanks . The book is in our library at Three Moons and as a member you are entitled to borrow it for your use for free.
