October 12th, 2024 DWG Meeting Presentation with Cory Alston

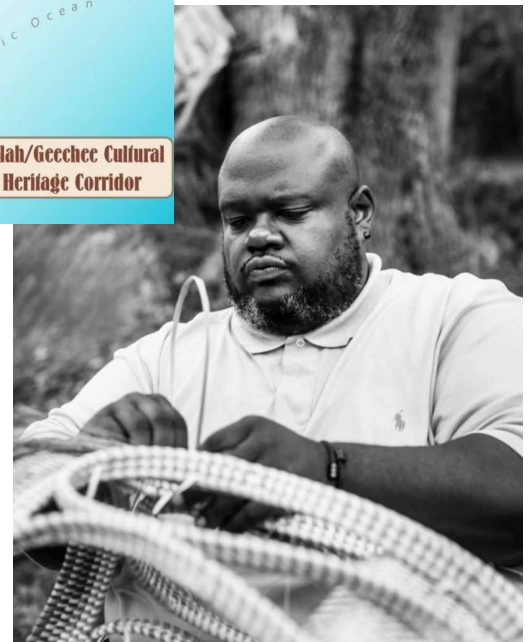
Corey Alston is a man who has been recognized by many for his tireless effort to keep his heritage alive for his generation. He has been featured on magazines, TV shows, and world-renowned museums. You can find in mostly keeping his artform alive by keeping the world informed on social media sites. Corey is a direct desendent of en-slaved Africans and is proud to teach others about his heritage by doing public educational talks all over the country.

Corey is a fifth generation Sweetgrass Basket Weaver and currently runs the family business in the Charleston City Market. Sweetgrass Basket Weaving has been a major part of the Gullah Geechee Culture, dating back to days of Enslavement. This coastal art form has been recognized as South Carolina State Handcraft and has been known to be found to be kept alive the longest along Sweetgrass Basket Makers HWY of South Carolina. This skill is one of the rare arts of our country that is founded nowhere else in America. Gullah Sweetgrass Baskets are a national treasure.
